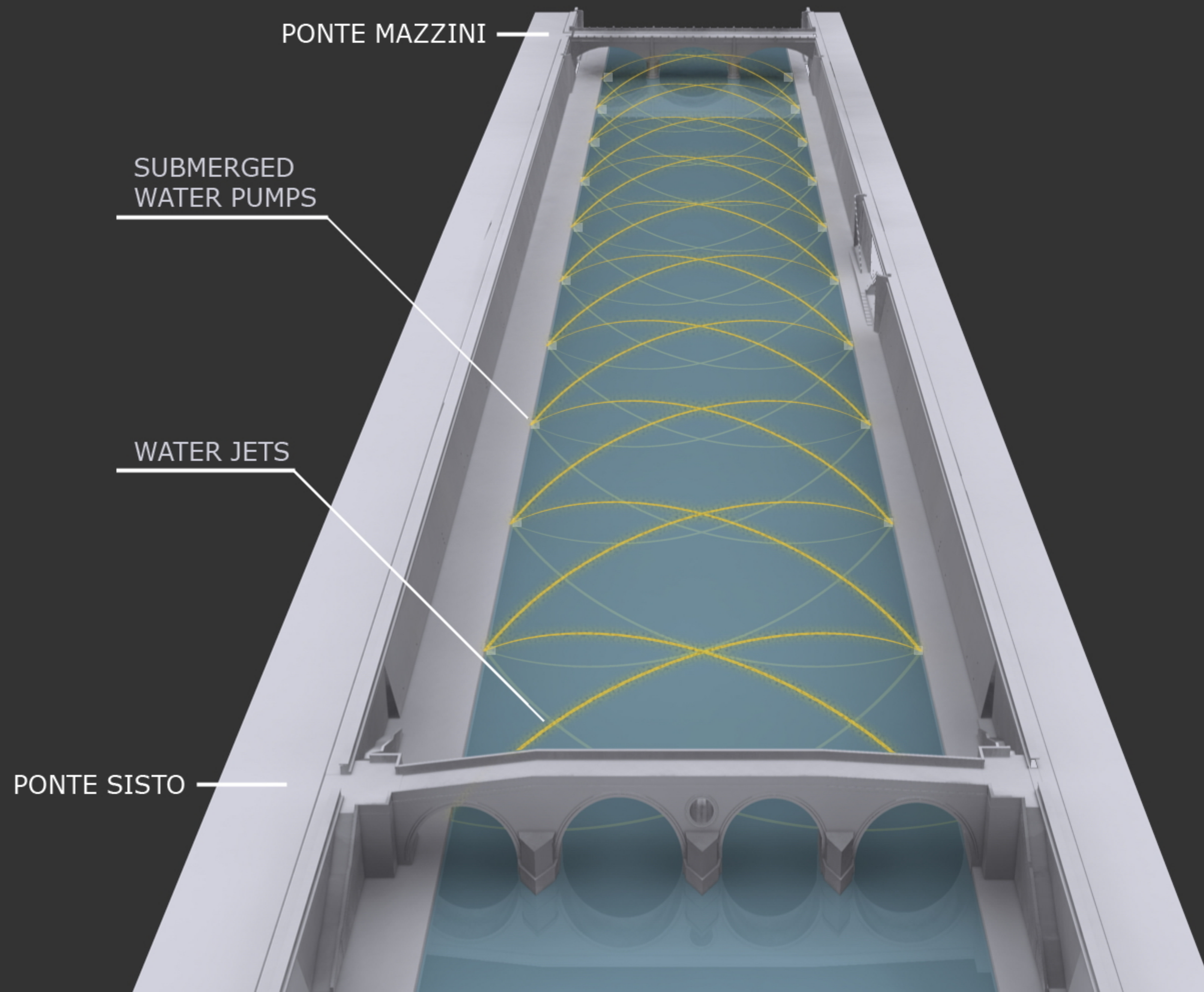
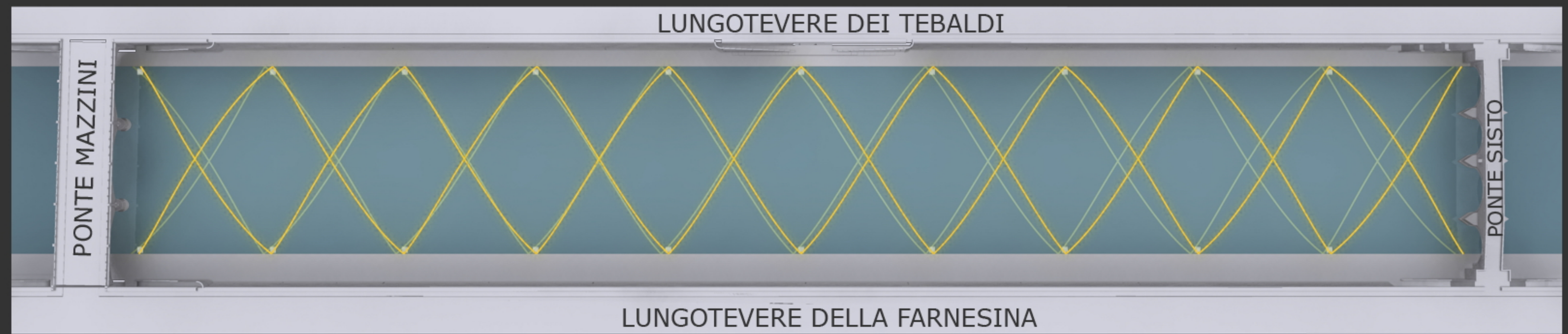


TEVERETERNO

Twelve proposals for the Tiber by Kristin Jones



FONTANA DEL TEVERE

Materials: Submerged Cycling Water Pumps, Purified River Water
Dimensions: 1800' L x 334' W (549m L x 102m W)

Celebrated in spectacular fountains throughout Rome's major piazzas, water has played a vital role in the city's history and development, but there is no fountain for the Tiber, the city's central water feature.

Fontana del Tevere is envisioned as a series of bisecting arcs of water crossing the Tiber, creating a domed corridor of choreographed, fluid jets along the entire length of Piazza Tevere.

Drawing the river into the air, the work will play upon the ebullience of water – the symbol of life, from which Rome itself grew. The work will be an exuberant call to recognize the long ignored river, activate the site, and bring life to the Tiber.
